First Clasp to the Cadet Force Medal

While serving with No. 10 (City of Palmerston North) Squadron, Major James Lower was awarded the Cadet Force Medal, presented by the Mayor of Palmerston North on 5 September 1999.

Major James Lower continued to serve with No. 10 Squadron as Training Officer, and then as the Unit Commander for two years before retiring from Cadets in November 2004.

In September 2008 his Commission was reactivated and he was reinstated as Captain with the City of Porirua Cadet Unit. In September 2009 Major James Lower was given command of the unit and promoted to his present rank of Major.

Major James Lower was awarded the First Clasp to the Cadet Force Medal in recognition of a further eight years service to the New Zealand Cadet Forces. The First Clasp to the Cadet Forces Medal is awarded to:

Tristan Glen Will joined No. 41 (Kapi-Mana) Squadron as a Cadet in 1993. During the next 7 odd years he was promoted through the ranks to the rank of Cadet Under Officer.

Flight Lieutenant Tristan Will was accepted for a New Zealand Cadet Forces Commission and commissioned from rank to acting Pilot Officer effectively 1 January 2001.

In October 2002 he attended the NZCF Commissioning Course at RNZAF Base Ohakea and following the course was substantiated in rank.

In January 2003 he attended the Officers Outdoor Leaders Course at Dip Flat. In October 2003 he was promoted to the rank of Flying Officer.

In May 2008 he attended the NZCF Instructional Technique Course at HMNZS Philomel. In October of 2008 he was promoted to Flight Lieutenant.

On 9 December 2009, Flight Lieutenant Tristan Will took over as the Cadet Unit Commander of No. 41 (City of Porirua) Squadron. In July of 2010 he completed the NZCF Command Course at HMNZS Devonport.

Flight Lieutenant Tristan Glen Will was awarded the Cadet Forces Medal with effect from 1 January 2011 in recognition of 12 years of loyal and dedicated service to the New Zealand Cadet Forces, the Air Training Corps and the young people of Porirua. The Cadet Forces Medal is awarded to

The Gambia Shield Central Area Sea Cadet Efficiency Trophy Awarded to T.S. Taupo

This trophy is awarded to the Central Area Sea Cadet unit that is judged to run the most efficient unit. This is the 2nd time that the unit has won the trophy in recent years.

The K. & P.L. Bolton Rifle Shooting Trophy Central Area Shooting Trophy Awarded to No. 41 (City of Porirua) Squadron

This trophy is awarded to the Central Area team that attains the highest aggregate score in the annual .22 calibre shooting competition. Whilst little is currently known about the inception of this trophy in 1943, it has been reintroduced in 2007 as the Central Area Shooting Trophy. This is the 4th Consecutive year the Squadron has won the trophy and the 8th time in recent years.

The Sir Richard Bolt Trophy Brevet Club Wellington Awarded to No. 41 (City of Porirua) Squadron

Air Marshal Sir Richard Bolt CBE, who is Patron of the Air Training Corps Association of New Zealand donated this trophy through the Brevet Club to encourage inter-unit shooting between the Wellington and Wairarapa Squadrons of Air Training Corps. This trophy is awarded to the team that attains the highest aggregate score in the annual .22 calibre shooting competition.
